

# Biography: Frank C. Miller, M.D.

Dr. Frank C. Miller is professor and former chair, of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine in Lexington. Prior to this, Dr. Miller was professor and chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, and Professor of Gynecology and Obstetrics at the University of Southern California.

He has served as president of the American College of Obstetricians & Gynecologists (ACOG), the Society of Maternal Fetal Medicine Society (SMFM), the Society of Perinatal Obstetricians and the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics. He also has been involved in other professional organizations including the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology, the American Gynecological and Obstetrical Society, the Society for Gynecologic Investigation and the Society of Obstetricians, Anesthesiologists, and Pediatricians. He is an honorary member of the Society of Obstetricians and Gynecologists of Canada and Fellow ad eundem of The Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in the U.K. Dr. Miller is a recipient of the SMFM Career Achievement Award.

In 1993 and 1994, Dr. Miller served as a committee member on the ACOG Liaison Task Force to the Clinton Administration on Health Care Reform. Dr. Miller chaired ACOG's Committee on Scientific Program in 1990 and was general chair of the 1991 Annual Clinical Meeting. He has also served on ACOG's Health Care Commission, the Long-Range Planning Committee, and the Course Coordination Committee.

Dr. Miller received his undergraduate degree from Murray State College in Murray, Kentucky, and his medical degree from the University of Louisville School of Medicine. He completed his residency in obstetrics and gynecology at Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii, and a fellowship in maternal-fetal medicine at Women's Hospital at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles.

He currently serves as an editorial consultant for three professional journals including ACOG's Obstetrics & Gynecology, Journal of Maternal-Fetal Medicine, and The American Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

Board certified in obstetrics and gynecology and a maternal-fetal medicine subspecialist, Dr. Miller's research interests include fetal heart rate, uterine activity monitoring, intrapartum assessment of the fetus with a special interest in the etiology and significance of meconium passage in utero, and hemodynamic changes during preeclampsia. He is a three-time recipient of ACOG's Purdue Frederick Award for Excellence in Medical Research.
